Harmful household pests

Harmful household pests are transported into apartments on people, clothing or furniture that has fabric on them or even with bird nests that can be for instance found in the attic. They live in apartments, clothes as well as on people and animal hair or skin. In general, poor hygiene and untidiness increase the appearance of household pests. They can also be transported in a luggage coming from abroad.

Whenever pests are found, immediate action is taken to eradicate them. Do not hesitate to contact the housing company manager, the housing company conducts the extermination of the pests with the help of professional pest controllers!

Bed bugs and cockroaches

- If there are bed bugs or cockroaches in your apartment, contact your housing company manager immediately to initiate the extermination by professionals and, if necessary, consult your health center if you have bed bugs bites.
- Do not bring any furniture into the staircase or the basement storage compartment, they must be directly taken to the waste disposal site for destruction so that the pests inside them do not spread in the housing compound!
- If the insect control is not done, they may move to the adjacent apartment and the problem will escalate inside the housing compound!



Cockroaches and bed bugs (pictured) spread very easily from house to house and can only be eradicated by poisons used by professionals. If you see any or, for example, dark spots left by bed bugs on your furniture in your home, contact your housing company manager or home care maintenance company right away.
